



USAID OCEAN PLASTICS REDUCTION ACTIVITY WHY AND WHAT FOR?

- Municipal solid waste generation 10,768 MT/D
- Total plastics waste generation 938.42 MT/D
- Open burning of plastics 419.47 MT/D
- PET bottles usage 1,250 MT/M
- Yoghurt cups 30 to 50 Millions per month
- Lunch sheets over 10 million are disposed on a daily basis
- Plastics import expenditure Over USD 700 mil in 2017
- Municipal Solid Waste Collection approximately 30%
- Plastics waste collection 300.30 MT/D
- Official recycling rate is less than 10%

- Private Sector Engagement
 - A comprehensive private-sector engagement strategy will be developed.
- Localization

 - Support locally-led SWM initiatives.
- Gender and Social Inclusion
 - Gender equality, women's and girls' empowerment.
 - Equal opportunities for women, youth and marginalized groups.

PROPOSED SITES AND FACTORS CONSIDERED IN SITE SELECTION

Through a data-driven methodology

The criteria used in this exercise include 1) vulnerability to ocean plastics pollution 2) potential plastics usage and plastics waste generation


3) an enabling environment
